**Parts of Speech**

In English language, all the words have some function to perform. So, each word plays a vital role in a sentence as conveying the meaning to the intent of the sentence., According to use and work as their syntactic functions, the words which are classified into different kind or classes are called Parts of Speech. They are eight in numbers as follows:

1. **Noun** - Nouns are the words that are used as the name people, places, animals, ideas and things.

Example: - ***Akbar*** was a great king.

In the sentence, the word ***Akbar*** denotes the Name of the king who was the famous Mohal Emperor. The picture of ***Akbar*** will be shown in the Smart board which may be animated as warier in the battle field.

2. **Pronoun** - The words that are used to substitute or replaces a noun in a sentence are called as Pronouns .

Example: - As Omprakash is ill, ***he*** will not come to college.

In the above sentence, the word ***he*** is used as substitute of the noun Omprakash or the noun Omprakash is replaced by the word ***he***. So, the word ***he*** is called as Pronoun. The picture of ***Omprakash*** will be shown in the Smart board.

3. **Verb** - The words which denote an action that is being performed by the noun or the subject in a sentence is called Verb or action words.

Example: - The President Bush ***is running*** on the ground. (Present Continuous Tense)

In the above sentence, the words '***is running***' denotes the action that is being performed by the noun or the subject '***President Bush***'. So, the words '***is running***' is the verb. Animation can be created for the representation of the verb in the smart board. Or can be shown by downloading videos directly from website.

4. **Adverb** - The words that are used to provide more information about verbs, adjectives and other adverbs used in a sentence is called as .Adverbs.

Example: - She cooked the food ***quickly***.

In the above sentence, the word '***quickly***' gives more information about the verb 'cooked'. So, the word '***quickly***' is known as an Adverb. Animation is to be created as the lady cooked the food '***quickly***'.

5. **Adjective** - The words which are used to modify or describe or provide more information about the noun or the subject in a sentence is called as Adjectives.

Example: - Ragu is a **strong** man to join in the Army.

In the above sentence, the word '**strong**' describe the noun 'Ragu'. So, the word '**strong**' is known as Adjective. Animation is to be created as Ragu is doing work strongly in the Army.

6. Conjunction - The words which are used to connect the different parts of a sentence, phrases and clauses is called as Conjunction.

Example; - Mala has not finished her project, **yet** She went out with her friends.

In the above sentence, the word '**yet**' connect two main clauses. So, the word '**yet**' is known as conjunction. Animation is created like Mala is doing project but without finishing her project she went out with her friends and displayed in the Smart board.

7. Preposition - The words which are used to link among the part of the sentence is called as Preposition. It shows the position or relation of the object or subject in a sentence.

Example: - The Drawing Master asked the students to draw picture **on** the paper.

In above sentence, the word '**on**' plays as linking word where it has to be drawn in the paper. So, the word '**on**' is known as Preposition. Animation is to be created in such a way that students are drawing '**on**' the paper and displayed in the Smart board.

8. Interjection - The words which have no grammatical relation in a sentence used to convey strong emotions or feelings as exclamation is called as Interjection.

Example: - **Oh!** I have lost my money.

In the above sentence, the word '**Oh**' conveys the strong emotion which comes by loss of money. So, the word '**Oh!**' is known as Interjection. Animation is to be created like someone is expressing as '**Oh!**' for the event of losing money which will be displayed in Smart board.

## Conclusion

Every process of teaching has a craving that teaching should be as effective as possible and should be carefully attended to, clearly understood and fixed in the minds of the learners. So that, the modern technology is used at every process of teaching. E-learning could supplement formal education by providing up-to-date quality material and information.
