Madurai jasmine blooms mainly during the summer months of April to June. However, it is widely distributed throughout the year. Since the flowers require warm conditions for their growth, they bloom more during summer. Madurai jasmine generally thrives at a temperature of 25 to 35°C. Sunlight between 6 and 8 hours daily is used for its growth. Jasmine grows in red gravel soil. It is naturally located in and around Madurai. This soil is called red carpet. It is said that the specialty of Madurai is that it has soil suitable for the growth of jasmine. Vellaiappan, a jasmine flower wholesaler, says he buys flowers from farmers on a contract basis. The contract is often fixed at a certain amount per year. The deal ranges from Rs 50,000 to Rs 1 lakh. Jasmine flower wholesalers note that the contract money is determined by the farmers and the rich floral production and maintenance of their garden. The Madurai region naturally has a unique climatic condition suitable for the growth of jasmine flowers. Jasmine does not require much rain or snow to grow. It is enough to water the plants once in four days. Jasmine flower in particular blooms in large quantities in summer. Jasmine plants are difficult to grow in shady or cool areas. Thus, the climate of Madurai Malli causes the jasmine flower to be thick and the petals very dense, thick, and heavy. Flowers bloom well, especially in the climatic conditions of March, April, and May. This will also result in higher yields, the informants say.

Jasmine is cultivated in 12,000 hectares and 30,000 acres in Tamil Nadu. Jasmine is cultivated in 3,000 hectares in Madurai alone. Madurai district accounts for 25% of the production of jasmine flowers in Tamil Nadu. According to reports, 60,000 tonnes of jasmine flowers are produced annually in Madurai alone. (Kundril Kumar, 2019, Managar Madurai Andrum Intrum (in Tamil)) Jasmine plantations are abundant in the southern and northern taluks of Madurai and from Kariyapatti and Sevalpatti in Virudhunagar district to the area where Madurai airport is located. Jasmine is cultivated in about 5,000 acres in Nilakottai and Usilampatti block on the way to Kodaikanal. Jasmine cultivation thus supports the livelihood of many agricultural labourers in the region.
