A STUDY ANALYSING THE AWARENESS AND RECOGNITION OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN INSTITUTES OF HIGHER LEARNING WITH RESPECT TO CHENNAI CITY.

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ABSTRACT

Artificial intelligence which is a substitute for human intelligence is expected to be applied in almost all the sectors, such as education, marketing, e-commerce, banking and so on in the near future. The implementation of artificial intelligence is expected to increase the efficiency of the work performed, reducing the manual labour. The application of artificial intelligence in education would ensure teachers' focus in building higher and competing knowledge of the students. Thus, performance analysis of the students, self- monitoring assessments and analysis of dropouts shall be taken over by artificial intelligence. As a pioneering research in this field, the study provides insightful information for educators and detailed knowledge for academic theory building.

INTERPRETATION

The above table discloses the results the association between the overall performance, and use of artificial intelligence in the teaching and learning methods. The chi square test proves that there is no association between the overall performance and use of artificial intelligence in the teaching and learning methods. The calculated value 0.012 is less than the table value 3.325 at 5% significance level. Thus, the null hypothesis is accepted. It is evident that the implementation of artificial intelligence would not have much impact on the overall performance of the teaching and learning methods as artificial intelligence is still to be accepted and implemented in many of the higher education institutions.

FINDINGS OF THE STUDY

- There is higher level of awareness and familiarity of the concept of artificial intelligence among the respondents.
- Friedman rank test reveals that the assessment of students is identified as the major area where AI can be substituted followed by mentoring, updating learner's profile, learning management system, personalized learning and professional learning.
- The chisquare value reveals that artificial intelligence would not have any significant impact on the teaching and learning method which is majorly attributed to the fact that artificial intelligence is only a new concept to be used in educational institutions where increased level of awareness is required.

CONCLUSION

Artificial intelligence is expected to bring a major transformation in all the sectors including the education sector. However, there is not much of awareness about the scope and impact of artificial intelligence. It is yet

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to be implemented in full in India, thus the awareness level of artificial intelligence is little less than expected, resulting in uncertainty about the implications of artificial intelligence in higher learning. Artificial intelligence would definitely, emerge to be one of the most effective and efficient tools in the institutions of higher learning. It would act as a major substitute in the areas of evaluation and would be the most efficient tool among both teachers and students for higher learning, compared to the current methods.
