A human person "just cannot exist outside the inscription of a community with its processes of relationship, differentiation, interaction, and subjectivity," according to (Kincheloe, 2011).

The pursuit of meaning and purpose is a broader definition of spirituality offered by numerous academics (Drury, 2016; Dombo & Flood 2015; Chaube, 2015; Slade, 2011; Walsh, 2010). profundity in relationships with ourselves, others, and ultimate reality, however understood" (p. 59) by social work scholars Canda et al. (2010). In order to demonstrate that the confluence has shifted, Dr. Ramesh Singh, a professor of civil engineering at the Indian Institute of Technology-Kanpur, and his PhD candidate Anup Prasad examined Landsat satellite data from 1975, 1990, and 2000.

Sadhus (ascetics) believe that the site's relocation is auspicious and a sign of good things to come for humanity. A plunge at the sangam, when it flows westward, wipes away the sins of a billion years, according to Dr. Girija Shastri of the Allahabad-based Jyotish Karmakand Evam Adhyatam Shodh Sansthan, an astrology study center, who cited the ancient Hindu text known as the Padma Puran. The change is easily discernible. It's something we have never seen before," he continued.

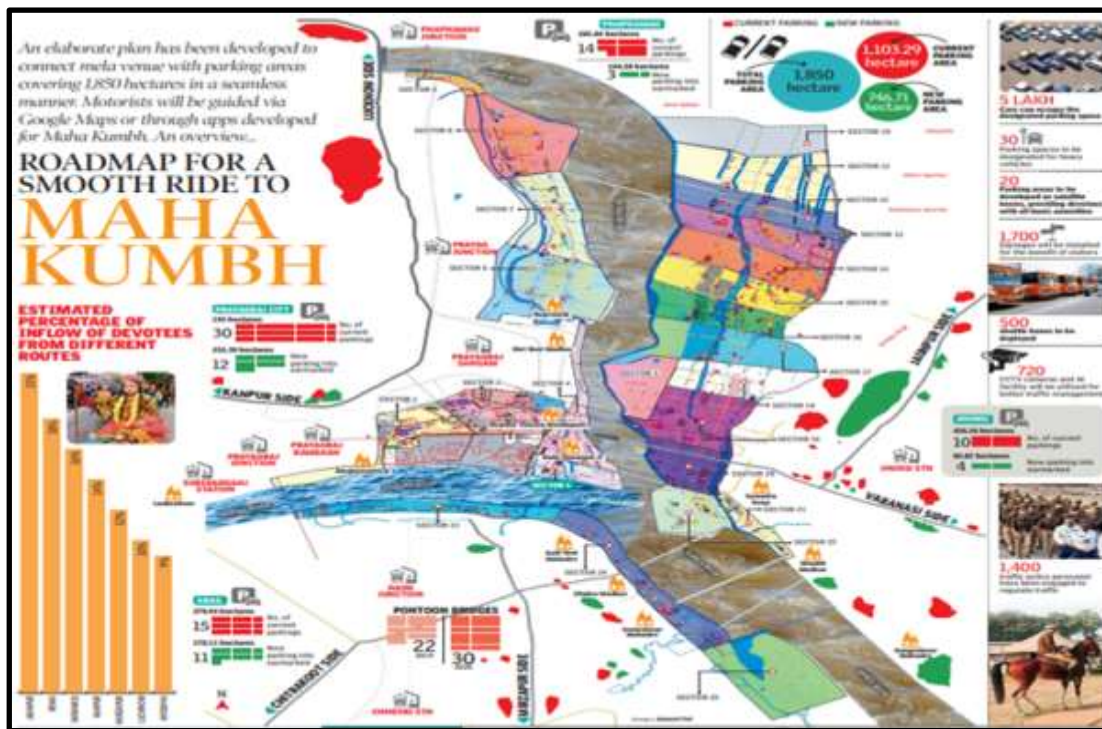

"Brands want the six snans (holy dip) to have the most visibility possible." During the 45 days, the snans (holy dip) account for nearly 70% of all branding expenditures at the Kumbh Mela. The Maha Kumbh's advertising rights are held by Crayons Advertising, whose chairman is Kunal Lalani, informed ET.

According to executives planning the massive event, companies that have purchased branding rights include ITC, Coca-Cola, Adani Group, Hindustan Unilever, Dabur, Bisleri, Park+, Emami, Reliance Consumer Products, Bank of Baroda, and SpiceJet. "To reach a larger audience, our activities (at the Kumbh) will be amplified through social media platforms and influencer collaborations," ITC's divisional chief executive for matches and agarbatti, Gaurav Tayal, told ET. According to executives, they are taking advantage of the chance to provide overseas guests with their first-time samplings and are also reaching out to customers in tier 2 and tier 3 locations.

In addition to travel and hospitality, startups and tech platforms in sectors like spiritual apps have set themselves up to profit from the Kumbh Mela. As Sandeep Goyal, chairman of Rediffusion, told TOI, "Events like Maha Kumbh allow brands to cash in on moment marketing; the visibility becomes manifold and most brands use this as an opportunity to showcase their innovation." Additionally, Maha Kumbh can serve as a useful testing ground for marketers, allowing them to get consumer input on new products they want to introduce to larger markets and adjust their strategy accordingly. "Such events allow brands to do test marketing which otherwise can be difficult," Goyal stated.
