Abstract

(Olympic Games movement in Manipur began to gather steam right from the 1970s of the last century when Nongthombam Maipak Singh won overall 5th position in international body building 1972 held at Paris France. Though a non Olympic Games, his achievement became a stepping stone for the youths of Manipur. It began to produce Olympians from 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games, USA and till Tokyo Olympics, it has 19 athletes, so far including 3 two timers, one Team captain and one three timers.

Government of India honoured sports achievers with prestigious rewards every year. Among the national achievers, Manipur has produced 19 Arjuna Awards, 2 with Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Awards (Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award), 5 Padma Shree Awards, 1 Padma Bhusan, 1 Padmavibhusan, 1 Dronacharya Award, 1 Dhyan Chand Award, winners, till date)

Introduction:

Olympic Movement in Manipur began to gain momentum in the form of sports achievement either individual or team events both in the domestic circuits and abroad including Olympics Games/ world cup, etc. The state has been producing numbers of national & international champions of both none Olympic or Olympic games since its merger into the Indian union on 21st September 1949 and the timeline started with the

participation of Nongthombam Maipak Singh at the world body building championship Paris France, 1972 and won overall 5th position.

In the field of sports excellence, the Directorate of Youth Affairs & Sports, Khuman Lampak, Imphal, Sports Authority of India, North Eastern Region Centre, Takyel, Imphal West, (1986) SAI, Utlou, Imphal, Takyelpat, Special Area Games, Khuman Lampak, Imphal, National Sports Academy Khuman Lampak, Imphal have contributed lots from time to time and the results can be treated excellent so far.

Performance and Medals won by Manipur at the National Games till date:

The little state of Manipur began to participate in the National Games of India since the 1st edition (modern version) of the game held in the year 1985 at New Delhi. The state began to perform well eversince and in the 5th National Games, Imphal 1999, Manipur won the prestigious Raja Bhallendra Trophy for being the winners of the overall team champion of the meet.

Manipur at the Olympics so far:

The 1st half of the 1980's became the eye opener of the state Olympic committee when a star was born in P. Nilkamal Singh who has created history as the first Olympian ever from the state to represent India team at the Los Angeles Olympic Games 1984. After him, Manipur became one among the states that has produced international champion/world cupper or Olympian at time intervals. So far, the state has produced 19 Olympians including three medal winners at the Olympic Games. The three medalists are Mrs. Mary Kom, a bronze medalist in women's boxing (London Olympics 2012), Saikhom Mirabai Chanu, a silver medalist (Tokyo Olympics 2020-21) and Shanglakpam Premkanta Sharma, a bronze medalist in Men's Hockey (Tokyo Olympics 2020-21). Among the Olympians, there are 3 two timers i.e one in boxing (w), one in Hockey (w) and one in weight lifting (w) as well as one three timer (Hat Trick) in archery sports. The state has also produced one national captain for Team India Hockey i.e P Sushilla Chanu of Manipur captained Indian women hockey team at the Rio Olympics 2016.

The Padma Awards were instituted in 1954 and awarded to citizens of India in recognition of their distinguished contribution in various spheres of activity including arts, education, industry, literature, science, sports, medicine, social service and public affairs. DHYANCHAND AWARDEE OF MANIPUR:

Dhyan Chand Award is India's highest award for lifetime achievement in sports and games, given by the Union Minister of Youth Affairs and SportsGovernment of India. The award is named after the legendary Indian hockey player Dhyan Chand. The award was initiated in 2002 carries a cash prize of INR 5 lakh (500,000 rupees), a statuette, ceremonial dress and a scroll of honour given only to the disciplines included in the events like Olympic Games, Paralympic Games, Asian Games, Commonwealth Games, World Championship and World Cup along with Cricket, Indigenous Games, and Parasports for further approval.

Manipur has produced one excellent coach who has won **DHYANCHAND AWARDEE** in the year **2010.**
