AYURVEDIC MANAGEMENT OF DARUNAKA W.S.R. TO DANDRUFF – A SINGLE CASE STUDY

Abstract:

In Ayurveda, head is said to be root of the body for possessing all special senses and prana, so one must protect and care the head. Everyone can passionate about good hair texture but in our modern era, due to varying factor of faulty dietary habits, stress, competitive lifestyle, lack of time, fashion trends and all kinds of pollution etc can contribute to hair and scalp damage. Darunaka can be correlated to dandruff/ Pityriasis capitis/ seborrheic dermatitis is a common condition encountered in clinical practice. It is an irritative disease of the scalp, affecting almost half of the population at the pre-pubertal age and of any gender and ethnicity. It occurs in both sexes and persons of all races. It is characterized by flakes, itching, dryness and hair fall. The response to treatment is commonly swift, but transient. So, there is a need to find a safe and effective remedy in the management of darunaka. This is case of darunaka with symptoms like itching of the scalp, hair fall, flanks over the head and dryness of scalp, came to shalakya tantra OPD and treated with ayurveda medicines like Aarogyavardhini vati(orally), Gandhaka rasayana(orally), Erandbhrista harde churna(orally), Keshasuddhikara churna (kesha prakshalanarthe) and Dhaturpatradi taila for shiroabhyanga. This medication was found very effective in curing signs and symptoms of darunaka and improving the overall condition of the scalp & recurrence was not found. the improvement provided by the treatment is assessed on the basis of sign and symptoms before and after the treatment.

INTRODUCTION:

Darunaka is a common problem in day today life. It can be correlated with dandruff in contemporary science. Darunaka means difficult to bear or tolerate. Acharya Vagbhata^{i ii} and Sharangadaraⁱⁱⁱ has opined Darunaka is one among the nine types of Kapalagata Rogas while Acharya Sushruta^{iv} and other explained darunaka under Kshudra Roga; having signs and symptoms of Daruna (cracked scalp), Kandura (itching of

the scalp), *Ruksha* (dryness of the scalp) and *Keshachyuti* (hair fall) etc due to the vitiation of *Vata* and *Kapha* Doshas.

Dandruff is a common scalp disorder affecting almost half of the population at the pre-pubertal age and of any gender and ethnicity. Dandruff is restricted to the scalp, and involved itchy, flaking skin without visible inflammation. Various intrinsic and environmental factors, such as sebaceous secretions, skin surface fungal colonization, individual susceptibility and interactions between these factors, all contribute to the pathogenesis of dandruff. The severity of dandruff may fluctuate with season as it often worsens in winter. V

It is a chronic, recurrent condition and patients generally experience frequent relapses. Prevalence of dandruff across the world have shown a 50% in the general population. vi

CASE STUDY

Case report-

A 30-year-old female patient came to OPD of *Shalakya tantra* department, Govt. Akhandanand *Ayurveda* hospital, Ahmedabad, Gujarat, India having following complaints,

- 1. Shirah kandu (itching on scalp) since2 months
- 2. Kesha chyuti (hair fall) since2 months
- 3. Flanks/scales over the head since1 months
- 4. Keshbhoomi rukshata (Dryness of scalp) since1 months

No any other Associated complaints.

History of present illness-

The patient was apparently normal before 2 months. Gradually she developed the symptoms like itching in scalp along with hair fall, flanks over the head and dryness of scalp. She also had undergone allopathic treatment but that provided her only temporary relief. Sweating is an aggravating factor & Oiling is Relieving factor.

There was no relevant past history was found and also no member of family had such illness.

General examination:

Diet: vegetarian

Pulse: 69/min

Urine: 5-6 times in day,0-1 time/night

Stool: Foul smell, Hard stool, 1 time /2day

Blood pressure: 130/90 mm/hg

Tongue: Coated

Local examination with gradation: (Table no. 1)

On inspection of scalp and hair:

- White powders on scalp and shoulder Grade 2
- Dryness on the scalp Grade 1
- Hair was dry and thin
- Hair pulling test- positive Grade 2

Based on the History and Clinical Examination, the Case was Clinically Diagnosed as a Diagnosis *darunak* (**Dandruff**).

3	Erandbhrista harde churna ^x orally	5 gm at night before sleep with warm water	30 days
4	Kesh shuddhikara churna ^{xi} (Aamalaki,Aristak,Sikakai) <i>Kesha Prakshalanarthe</i>	25 gm	Thrice per week for 30 days
5	Dhaturpatradi tailam ^{xii} <i>Abhyanga</i> (Massage)	Q.S.	Thrice per week for 30 days (Applied at night and next day morning, head bath is taken)

Scalp Care- Patient was advised to take care of his scalp:

Always use sterile cold water to wash your head.

Avoid using hot water for hair wash.

Don't apply heat and direct sunlight on scalp.

Comb hair only after hair gets dried after wash.

PATHYAPATHYA:

Pathya aahar – Ushna bhojan, Ushna Dugdha pana ,draksha, Takra, Karela ,sigru ,parval sevan

Apathya aahar & vihar – Vega dharan, Viruddha bhojana

RESULTS:

After 15^{th} & 30^{th} day assessment, gradual relief was found on each symptom's associated with *darunaka*. Effects of treatment on patient of *darunaka* are presented in Figure-1

Follow up condition: No recurrence after 30 days of completion of treatment.

DISCUSSION:

The cardinal features of *darunaka*, in our classical texts are like that of dandruff in contemporary science. vata and kapha are involved in the manifestation of darunaka. So, while treating darunaka, the drugs alleviating vata & kapha doshas, which are having kandughna (anti pruritic), kushtaghna (alleviates skin lesions) and as well possessing tikta (bitter), katu (pungent) rasa should be selected. As vata and kapha are involved in darunaka the drug chosen should be balancing kapha and vata.

The treatment should aim at reducing dryness, itching and scaling of scalp which causes much of the discomfort to patients.

Role of Aarogyavardhani vati- balances vata and kaphadosha and possess the pharmacological action likekusthanasaka (can alleviate all type of skin disorders.)^{xiii}

Role of Gandhaka rasayana- has properties of katu, kashaya rasa and ushnavirya. Thus, it acts as kaphaghna as well as kledaghna. According to yoga Ratnakar rasayana Adhikar chapter gandhakrasayana has kandughna and kusthaghna properties.

Role of Erandbhista harde: Acc.to Bhavprakash erandbhrist harde having aamaghna and vatanuloman properties. In this case patient having c/o of vibandha so we choose this drug for koshtha suddhi. This is first step of any kind of treatment.

Role of keshshuddhikar churana: It contains dravyas like aamalaki, aristaka and sikakai. Properties having keshya and keshsuddhikara. It can prevent dandruff, promote hair growth, stop hair loss.

Role of *Dhaturpatradi taila*: It having properties like *kaphahara*, *vatashamaka*, *kandughna*, *krumihara*, Keshya xiv The mode of action of taila as shiroabhyanga increases the blood circulation in the scalp and absorption of the drug in scalp. Thus, due to the different properties of taila like snigdhaguna, katu, tikta rasa, ushna virya removes vitiated dosha from the srotas and helps in curing the disease.

Altogether the synergistic action of medicinal preparations prescribed have helped in reduction of dryness, itching, scaling of scalp and nourishing hair roots in a span of 15 days.

CONCLUSION:

The prognosis of *darunaka* is included in *sadhya* stage according to *vagbhata*. This case report includes *ayurvedic* management of *darunaka* with internal and external medicines. We found this treatment is safe, effective, having sustainable result in *darunaka*. And it improves the quality of life of the patient. The *ayurvedic* management of *darunaka* has a strong possibility to breakdown the pathogenesis of this disease. The recovery in this present case was promising and worth documenting.
