The characters and stories of hunger and poverty were enough to break the reader. One can experience pictures of life turning into bone marrow in hunger that burns everything in *Janmadinam* and *Visappu*. Basheer's writings deal with internal experiences as well as world experiences.

Basheer's *Janmadinam* is a reflection of the depths of hunger that question pride. The protagonist, who is completely hungry on his birthday, explains how painful hunger can make a human being. The protagonist, who claims that his own body is someone's food, also reflects Basheer's sense of justice for hunger. Everywhere billions of men and women are starving. Basheer sighs that he himself was among them.

The story *Amma* is about a mother who prepares dinner every night and waits for her son. In this story, we find the motherhood that is always vigilant against hunger. This is a story that symbolizes pre-independence India, its poverty, hunger and slavery. Through this story Basheer asks his mother why she gave birth to him to this unfortunate land full of hunger, slavery and disease. The mother who asks the one who only cares to wear a *khadar mundu* and a *khadi* shirt, whether this pride satisfies their appetite is a symbol of hunger for every Indian. The beggar in the story *Bharata Mata* is a direct picture of hunger with her eyes closed, her cheeks bent and her bones bent inwards. The boy with sore skin and the blind girl with the protruded stomach are the remnants of hunger. The memory the eldest son who was starved and finally caught in an attempted robbery and died in prison breaks the heart of both the protagonist and the reader. The sight of the lady walking with the blind girl after a sumptuous food, he remarks "Me too have hunger". It is here that the hunger pangs from the inside are revealed.

Basheer is trying to find the depth of hunger that he has experienced for himself and his companions. Basheer's writings were able to express human reality in depth. Growing up seeing and experiencing the misery of hunger Basheer tries to portray these expressions through his works.
