Women will be able to sell their products at zero initial cost.

Acharya.P.B.(2018) called on women's group to be pacemaker for development of state through skill development to improve the economy and solve problem of unemployment in the State.


Table 1.1 shown below are the micro units of North Eastern States of India established by women under PMEGP, during the period from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
