Nature Of Question Asked: The questionnaire consists of 5-point Likert scale


LIMITATIONS OF THE STUDY








INFERENCE

TABLE 4: RESPONDENTS OPINION ON WORKLOAD AFFECTS ON PHYSICAL HEALTH.


