## II. LITERATURE REVIEW

### A. Historical Roots of Ingredient-Based Hair Oils in India

#### 1. Ayurvedic Principles and Ingredients

The history of ingredient-based hair oils in India can be traced back to the ancient Ayurvedic system of medicine, which dates back over 5,000 years. Ayurveda, meaning 'knowledge of life,' is a holistic healing system that emphasizes the balance of mind, body, and spirit. In other words, Ayurveda emphasizes external and internal beauty.<sup>2</sup> In Ayurveda, hair care is considered an integral part of overall well-being, and natural ingredients play a pivotal role in maintaining healthy hair.

Ayurvedic texts have documented the use of various herbs, roots, and oils for hair care. Ingredients like amla, bhringraj, neem, and fenugreek have been traditionally used for their nourishing and therapeutic properties. These ingredients are believed to balance biological energies and promote hair growth while addressing common hair issues like dandruff and hair loss.

#### 2. Traditional Knowledge and Practices

Indian households have passed down the knowledge of ingredient-based hair care practices for generations. These practices involve elaborate rituals, including the application of warm oil to the scalp and hair, followed by a gentle massage. The oils are often infused with aromatic herbs and spices, creating a sensory experience that promotes relaxation and well-being.

### B. Hair Care Market Trends in India

#### 1. Market Size and Growth

The Indian hair care market, including ingredient-based hair oils, has witnessed remarkable growth in recent years. The market's size has expanded significantly, driven by factors such as rising disposable incomes, urbanization, and an increasing focus on personal grooming and self-care. The India haircare market size was INR 350.2 billion (USD4,737.6 million) in 2021 and is forecasted to record a CAGR of over 6% during 2021-2026.<sup>3</sup> This projection aligns with the CAGR calculator formula:  $FV = PV \times (1 + r)^n$ .

Where:

- FV = Future Value (Ending Value)
- PV = Present Value (Initial Value)
- r = Annual Growth Rate
- n = Number of compounding periods

Given the following values:

- CAGR = 6% = 0.06 (converted to a decimal)
- Initial Value (PV) = 350.2
- Duration (n) = 6 years

Given this formula, the expected increase in the skincare industry by 2026 would be approximately:

$$FV = 350.2 \times (1+0.06)^6$$

$$FV = 350.2 \times (1.41851089)$$

$$FV \approx 496.74$$

Expected Increase of the Hair Oil Industry by 2026 in India (In Billions INR)

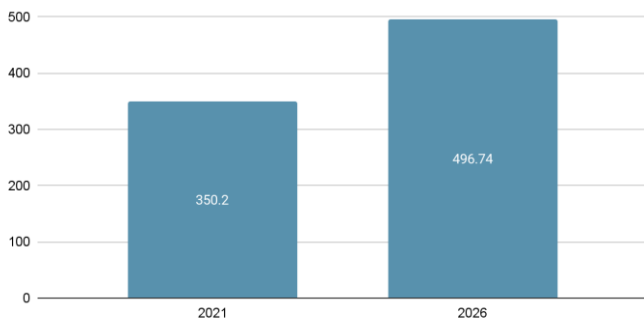


Figure 1: Expected Increase of the Hair Oil Industry by 2026 in India

Therefore, the total expected value of the skincare industry by 2026 would be approximately INR 496.74 billion (5.99 billion USD). This means that the industry would have an overall percentage increase of 41.84% over the next 6 years. The key cities in the India haircare market are Mumbai, Kolkata, Delhi, Bangalore, Chennai, and Pune among others. Mumbai emerged as the largest haircare market in India in 2021, followed by Delhi.<sup>4</sup>

The market’s growth is reflected in the expanding product offerings, with manufacturers introducing innovative formulations and packaging to cater to diverse consumer needs and preferences. The emergence of e-commerce platforms has also played a pivotal role in reaching a broader

consumer base, especially in remote areas.

Source of Information for Customers

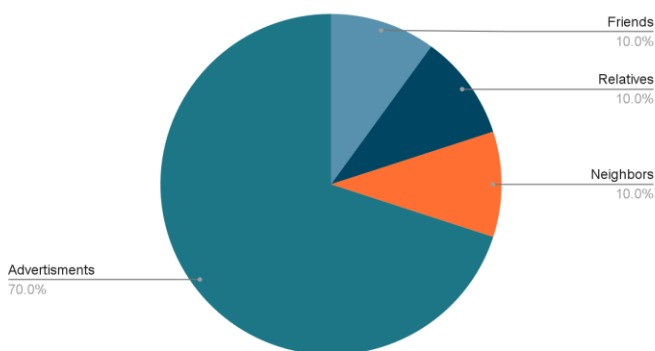


Figure 2: Source of Information for Customers

- **Advertisements (70%):** The majority of consumers in Karnataka rely on advertisements as their primary source of information about Parachute oil. This suggests that advertising campaigns play a significant role in creating awareness and influencing consumer decisions in this region.
- **Friends (10%):** A smaller but notable portion of consumers seek information from their friends. Word-of-mouth recommendations and personal experiences shared by friends appear to be influential in this context.
- **Relatives (10%):** Similarly, information from relatives holds a similar weight as that from friends, indicating that family connections and recommendations are also valuable sources of information.
- **Neighbors (10%):** Neighbors represent another source of information for a segment of consumers. This suggests that local networks and community interactions play a role in shaping consumer knowledge.

Place of Purchase for Customers (Excluding Online)

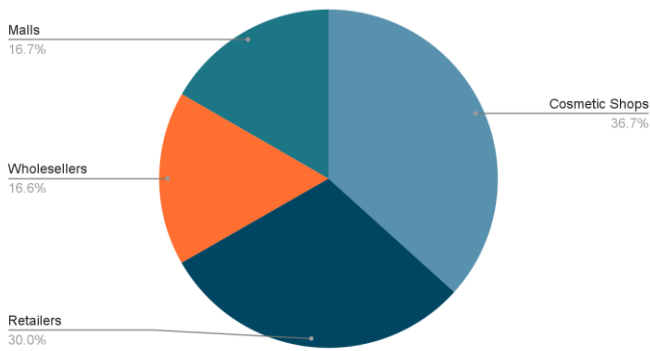


Figure 3: Place of Purchase for Customers

- **Retailers (30%):** Retailers represent another significant channel for consumers, with a considerable proportion preferring to buy Parachute oil from these outlets. Retailers typically offer a wide range of products, making them a convenient choice for many.
- **Wholesalers (16.6%):** A segment of consumers opt for wholesalers as their source of purchase. This choice may be driven by factors such as bulk purchasing or accessibility to specific products.
- **Malls (16.66%):** A similar proportion of consumers prefer to purchase Parachute oil from malls. Malls often provide a diverse shopping experience, including hair care products, attracting this segment of consumers.

This pie chart presents valuable insights into the primary places of purchase for Parachute Oil among consumers in Karnataka. Understanding where consumers prefer to buy these products is important for businesses and marketers to tailor their distribution strategies effectively.

The following are the key findings:

- **Cosmetic Shops (36.66%):** The largest portion of consumers in Karnataka choose to purchase Parachute oil from cosmetic shops. This indicates that consumers in the region often visit specialized cosmetic shops for their hair care needs.

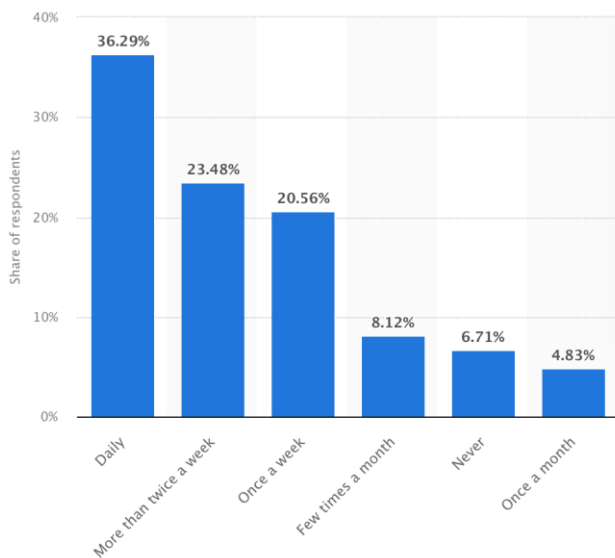


Figure 4: Frequency of Hair Oil Usage in Indians

The graph<sup>5</sup> represents the different levels of frequency of hair oil use among Indians. Following is the interpretation of the graph:

- **Daily (36.29%):** A significant portion of respondents, approximately 36% reported using hair oil products on a daily basis. This suggests that a considerable number of individuals in India incorporate hair oil into their daily grooming routines.
- **More than twice a week (23.48%):** Nearly a quarter of respondents, around 23.48%, indicated that they use hair oil products more than twice a week but not necessarily every day. This frequency level signifies that many people in India use hair oil frequently, although not on a daily basis.
- **Once a week (20.56%):** About 20.56% of respondents reported using hair oil products once a week. This is a significant portion and reflects a weekly hair care routine for a substantial number of individuals.
- **Few times a month (8.12%):** A smaller percentage, approximately 8.12%, stated that they use hair oil products a few times a month. This group uses hair oil less frequently but still incorporates it into their hair care routines.
- **Never (6.71%):** A minority of respondents, around 6.71%, indicated that they never use hair oil products. This suggests that a small but notable segment of the population in India does not include hair oil in their hair care practices.
- **Once a month (4.83%):** A relatively smaller percentage, approximately 4.83%, mentioned using hair oil products once a month. This group uses hair oil less frequently than the weekly or daily users but still incorporates it into their routine.

## C. Key Ingredients and Formulations

### 1. Popular Natural Ingredients in India Hair Oils

Ingredient-based hair oils in India feature a wide array of natural components, each of them chosen for its unique properties. Some of the most popular ingredients include:

- **Amla (Indian Gooseberry):** Amla is rich in Vitamin C and antioxidants, amla nourishes hair, prevents premature graying, and strengthens hair follicles. Mainly its oil and aqueous extract are used in hair care formulations.<sup>6</sup>
- **Bhringraj:** Known as the “king of herbs” for hair, bhringraj promotes hair growth, reduces hair fall, and improves hair texture. It makes a very good hair tonic and is used as a constituent in hair formulation for healthy, black, and long hair.<sup>7</sup>
- **Coconut Oil:** Oil of coconut fruit is used in different hair formulations such as shampoos and hair oil.<sup>8</sup> Renowned for its moisturizing properties, coconut oil prevents protein loss, reduces breakage, and adds shine.
- **Neem:** With its antibacterial and antifungal properties, neem helps combat dandruff and scalp infections. Neem seed and seed oil contain different bitter limonoids including nimbin, nimbibin, salanin, etc. many commercial shampoos contain neem oil for the control of ticks, fleas, and lice.<sup>9</sup>
- **Hibiscus:** Hibiscus flowers and leaves are used to stimulate hair growth, prevent hair loss, and improve hair color.

## 2. Formulation and Benefits

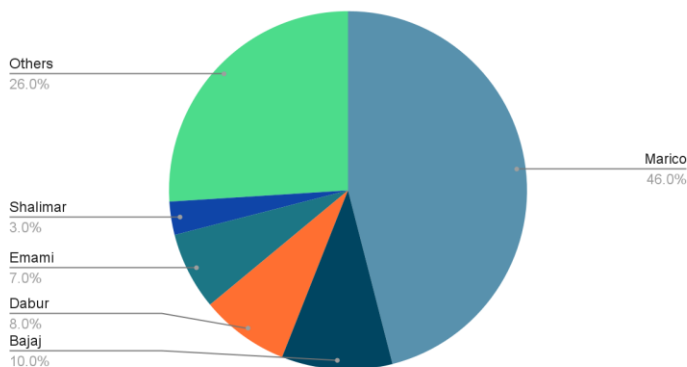
Ingredient-based hair oils are carefully formulated to harness the benefits of these natural ingredients. The oils are often infused with a combination of herbs and spices, which are either cold-pressed or heated to extract their essence. These formulations provide nourishment, promote blood circulation to the scalp, and help maintain hair's natural shine and strength. The oils also offer a calming and therapeutic experience during application.

### D. Market Players and Competition

#### 1. Major Brands in the Segment

India's hair care and styling products market is highly fragmented due to the presence of various international players and regional players such as Dabur India Ltd and Marico Limited. Procter and Gamble, Unilever PLC, L'Oreal, and others. Product innovation is one of the most adopted strategies where players infuse natural and organic ingredients in hair care and styling products to meet the growing hair concerns of the consumers, such as hair fall, dandruff, color protection, and others.<sup>10</sup>

The Pie chart<sup>11</sup> depicts the market share percentage for total hair oil sales in India, with each brand representing a specific portion of the market. Following is the interpretation of the pie chart:

- **Marico (46%):** The largest segment of the pie chart is occupied by Marico, accounting for 46% of the total hair oil market share in India. This indicates that Marico is the market leader, capturing a significant portion of the market.

- **Bajaj (10%):** Bajaj holds the second-largest market share at 10%. While smaller than Marico, Bajaj still maintains a notable presence in the Indian hair oil market.

- **Dabur (8%):** Dabur follows closely with an 8% market share. Dabur is a significant player in the industry, although its market share is smaller than Marico and Bajaj.

- **Emami (7%):** Emami accounts for 7% of the market share, positioning itself as another substantial contributor to the hair oil market in India.
- **Shalimar (3%):** Shalimar holds a smaller portion of the market share at 3%. While it represents a relatively modest segment, Shalimar still has a presence in the industry.
- **Others (26%):** The "Others" category collectively represents 26% of the market share. This category includes all other hair oil brands and companies not specifically listed in the data set. While individually smaller than the leading brands, the cumulative market share of these other brands is significant.

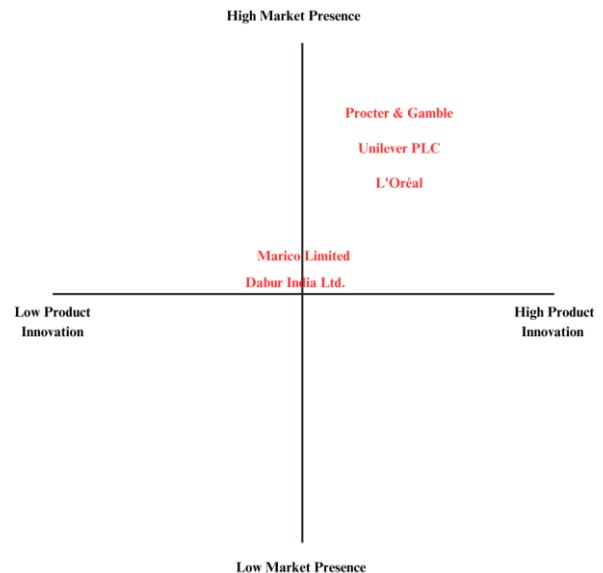


Figure 6: Position Mapping for Market Players

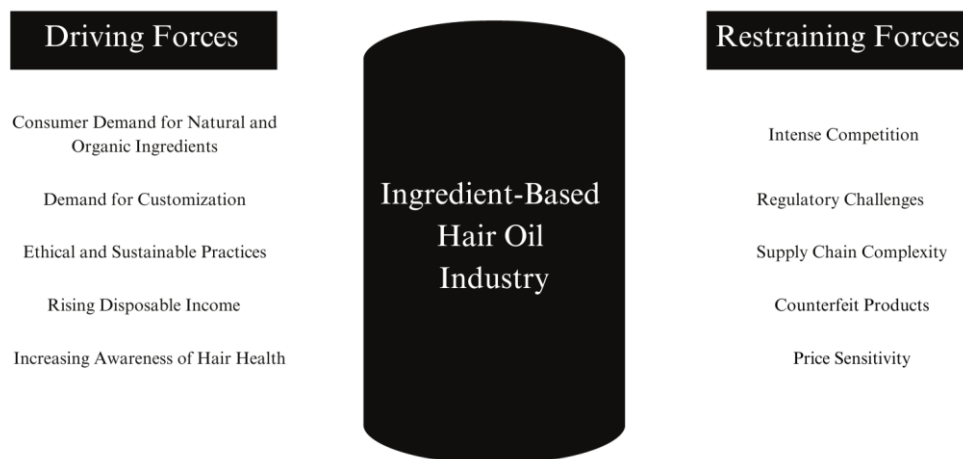


Figure 7: Force Field Analysis

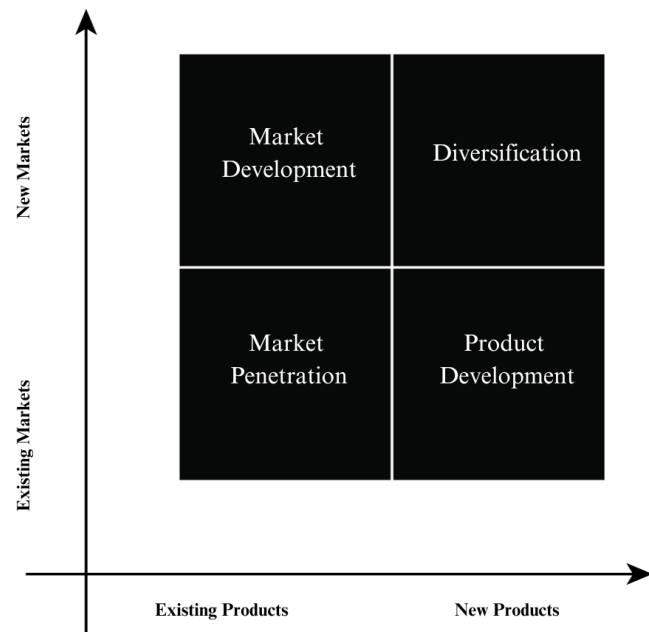


Figure 8: The Ansoff Matrix

Efficient supply chain management and sourcing of quality ingredients are critical challenges in the production of ingredient-based hair oils.

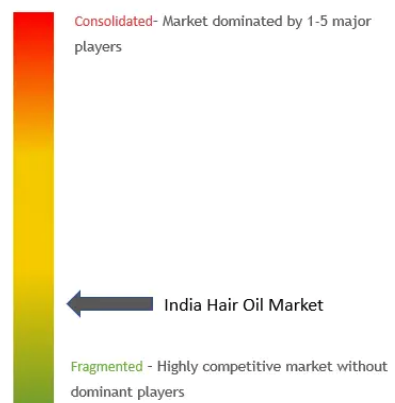

- **International Regulatory Bodies:** Regulatory bodies in target export markets have a low interest in the Indian industry but exert significant influence through product regulations and certification requirements.

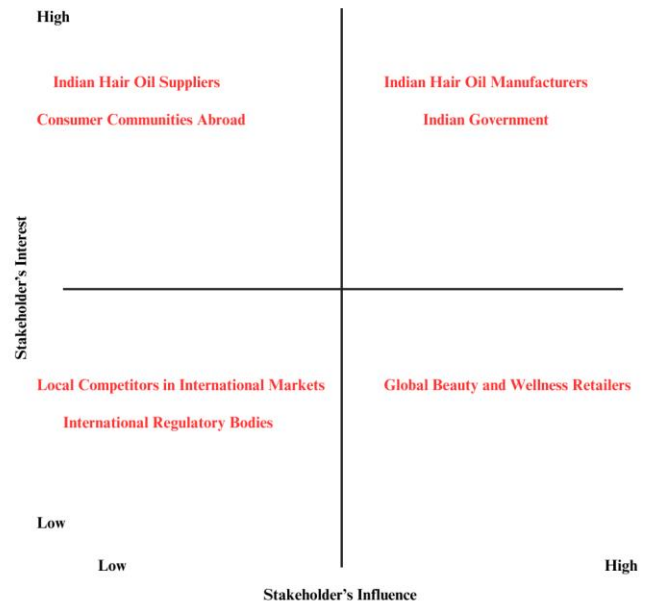


Figure 10: Stakeholder's Mapping
