His father’s name was Late Dr. Krishna Kumar Bhatnagar a veteran educationist and his mother’s name was Late Rajwati Bhatnagar a very pious and religious woman. - **Dr. Atul Sir's firm resolve to become a Doctor**

Dr. Atul Sir's father applied for the post of Head of the Department Economics but his candidature was rejected on casteist ground. Then he left Meerut to join Municipal Post. Graduate college at Mussoorie as HOD Economics Then he became Principal of MPG College Mussoorie. So he gained the recognition at Mussoorie that was denied to him at Meerut. In the Meantime Dr. Atul Sir prepared for his CPMT examination.

- **Dr. Atul Sir qualifies CPMT examination**

In the year 1971 Dr. Atul Sir qualified CPMT Examination. He sought admission at LLRM Medical College, Meerut as he obtained good rank CPMT examination. Dr. Atul Sir further narrates his experiences of the Medical College. He was a brilliant student who not only scored highest marks but also received many awards and honours.

- **Inception of Subharti Service Institution:-**
